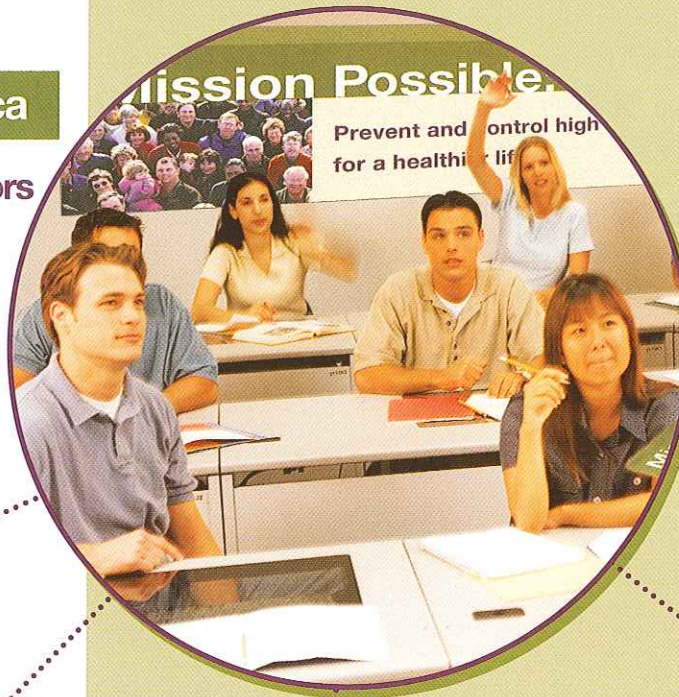
Promote Healthy Eating:

Work with cafeteria dieticians to promote healthy eating and nutritious options. Make sure vending machines stock healthy choices.



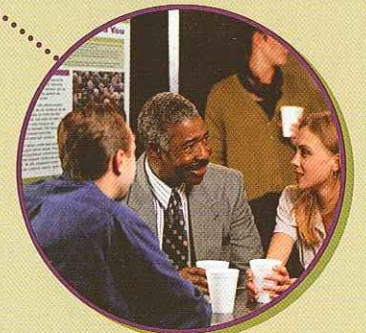
Bolster Sporting Events with Health Promotions:
